

Instantly recognizable by their distinctive colourful cans, the craft beers at *Farnham Ale & Lager* feature a number indicating their level of bitterness. You can tour the facilities, sample beers in the tasting room and, in summer, sit out on the terrace. (Reservations are necessary.)

Favourite: The prize-winning Scotch Ale

Nearby attractions: La Fromagerie des Cantons, Au Saucisson vaudois, Parachutisme Nouvel Air

Auberge Sutton Brouerie lays claim to being the only microbrewery in Quebec whose beers are made with brettanomyces (more commonly known as wild yeast). Flavourful and tough but easy on the palate, the beers make a great accompaniment to the local fare served at the pub. Guided tours of the facilities are available for groups (minimum 6 people).

Favourite: Session Abénaki (made with 100 % Simcoe hops)

Nearby attractions: Le Cafetier, Mont Sutton, Parc d'environnement naturel de Sutton

La Mare au Diable, in the heart of downtown Sherbrooke, is definitely worth a visit. Sample 100% artisanal, unpasteurized and unfiltered beers, brewed on site, in a warm, relaxed setting. Situated at the top of rue King, this microbrewery has a terrace with a fantastic view!

Favourite: A beer menu that rotates with the seasons

Nearby attractions: Maison du Cinéma, Lac des Nations Boardwalk

Offering tasty, unusual products, *Le Grimoire* suggests you visit its brewery, at 1546, rue Principale, to see how they are made. Guided tours are available for groups (minimum 4 people, reservations are necessary). Then, why not sample the menu at the cozy resto-pub?

Favourites: La Vie de Château (made with spicy rum) and Désérables (perfect for those with a sweet tooth)

Nearby attractions: Granby Zoo, Boutique Le Grimoire, cycling trails

A l'Abordage is housed in a building that dates back to 1843. Its brewing facilities have windows so you can satisfy your curiosity while you sample its excellent British- and American-style beers. You might find it difficult to choose between the pub's famous fish 'n' chips and the duck poutine!

Favourite: Captain Hook (a honey stout)

Nearby attractions: Parc d'environnement naturel de Sutton (hiking and skiing), cycling trails

The granddaddy of Quebec microbreweries (it was founded in 1986) is known for its consistently high-quality products and has the feel of a typical English pub. (It's housed in a converted Victorian-era mansion.) Enjoy a plate of classic fish 'n' chips while you marvel at the pub's collection of 2,000 beer cans! Guided tours of the brew house are available (individuals or groups) but they have to be booked in advance.

Favourite: Lim's Pride (a British-style beer)

Nearby attractions: Uplands Cultural and Heritage Centre, Capelton Mine and the village of North Hatley

La Brasserie Vrooden specializes in traditional German beers using a time-honoured brewing technique called "decoction." Its specialty beers are brewed every 6 to 8 weeks and sold from time to time at specialty stores. They will soon be available at the brewery's new tasting room as well. Brewery tours are available. (Reservations are necessary.)

Favourites: Helle and Weizen

Nearby attractions: Granby Zoo, Bromont Water Park, Granby international – Voitures Anciennes (Vintage automobiles)

On offer at this bistro, which is situated in a heritage building at the mouth of Lake Memphremagog, are some 15 artisanal brews, along with typical pub fare. Among the unique features of the beers are their unusual names and their eye-catching labels. It is possible to visit the brewing facilities but by appointment only.

Favourite: Kilt – a Scottish Ale with an alcohol content of 8% – not bad!

Nearby attractions: Marais de la rivière aux Cerises (wetlands), Abbaye Saint-Benoît-du-Lac, cycling trails

Beer lovers who appreciate flavourful brews will enjoy the products at *Moulin 7*, a combined microbrewery and bistro (don't miss the wild-boar burger!) where the décor is inspired by the town's industrial past. This venue also hosts comedy nights and musical performances. Visitors can tour the facilities, by booking in advance.

Favourite: Ciel ouvert, White session IPA

Nearby attractions: Jeffrey Mine Observatory, Parc régional du Mont-Ham, a 200-tonne truck, the prestigious Asbestos Golf Club

Whether you're returning from a day on the slopes or visiting with your family or friends, you'll love the traditional pub fare at this large brewery.

The brewer's favourite: White IPA

Customer favourite: Honey-Raspberry

At its 2 locations, *Siboire* offers microbrewery aficionados at least 9 different types of beer, all brewed on site. If you're looking for local food and happen to be at the rue Dépôt branch, we recommend you sample (among other things) the ever-popular fish 'n' chips! If, on the other hand, you're looking for something more elaborate, drop by the brew house on boulevard Jacques-Cartier where you'll find a menu worthy of the best bistros.

Favourite: InsPirAtion (an IPA brewed with a ton of New World hops)

Nearby attractions: Lac des Nations, Murals tour, Bouffe ton Centro (gastronomic festival)

Authentic, balanced beers and a bistro/brew house where you can tuck into that hugely popular (but decadent!) dish: fish 'n' chips. The owners delight in telling their customers that in Coaticook they don't just make delicious ice cream; they also make darned good beer!

Favourite: L'Abyssé de la Gorge (a oat stout)

Nearby attractions: Parc de la Gorge de Coaticook, Laiterie de Coaticook (ice cream manufacturer), Lake Lyster

Taking its cue from New England's brewery revival, *Brasserie Dunham* offers a range of artisanal "farmhouse" ales and very hoppy, spicy beers made with local ingredients. You can take a look at the brew house or sample the menu at La Table fermière.

Favourites: Leo's Early Breakfast IPA and Saison du Pinnacle

Nearby attractions: Clos Saragnat, L'Orpailleur (wineries), La Factrie

This establishment has an almost mythical reputation. Nicknamed "*the BOQ*" by its regular clientele, the microbrewery stands out because it offers such a wide variety of beers, as well as diverse cultural programming. Visit this rue Wellington landmark for a beer brewed on site (or from another Quebec microbrewery), a private import, a glass of cider a glass of «Quebec Kombucha,» which is fermented tea (and complement your choice with a beer pogo!). Better still, why not try your hand at improv on one of the open mic nights?

Favourite: Bou (IPA) – a tribute to Madame Bou, a well-known Sherbrooke personality

Nearby attractions: Théâtre Granada, Marché de la Gare, Musée de la nature et des sciences
